



After the survey was completed and a newly formed and stable slope was in place, Submar proposed to armor a section of the bank with a system of articulating concrete revetment mats. The mats would extend from the toe of the slope, up and over one 8" pipeline, with the ends buried a minimum of 4" in an anchor trench. This would provide hard armor protection for the pipelines and slope protection for the underlying soils, creating and maintaining a stable bank. Submar faced a site access challenge due to gates containing livestock, but the work went as planned without any incidents. The job was completed by cleaning, dressing, and reseeding all disturbed areas.



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
